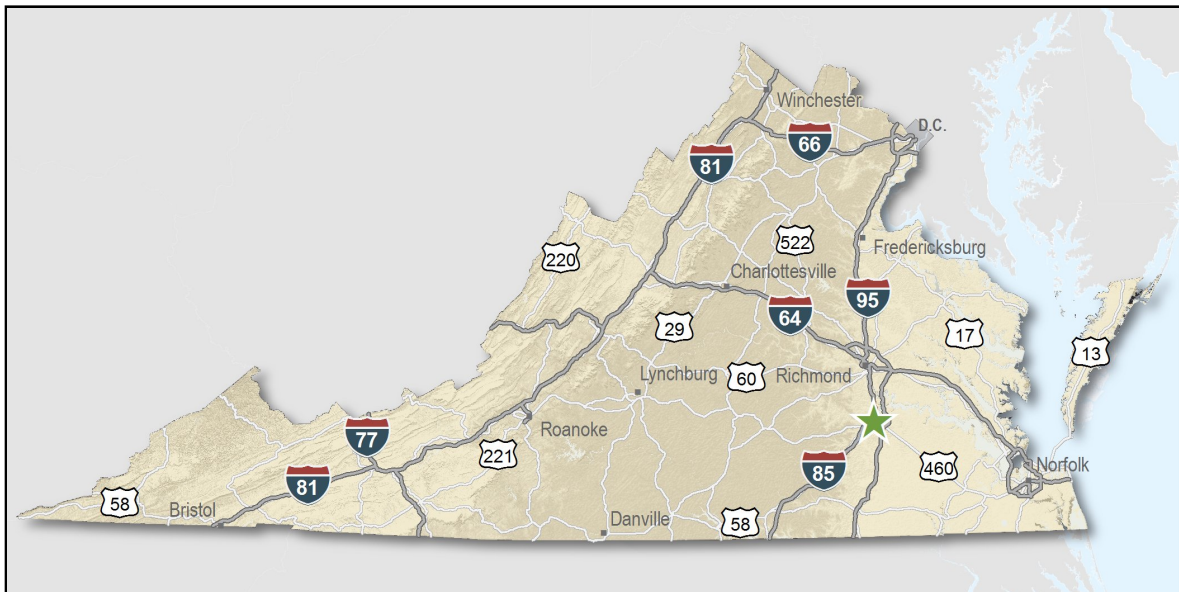

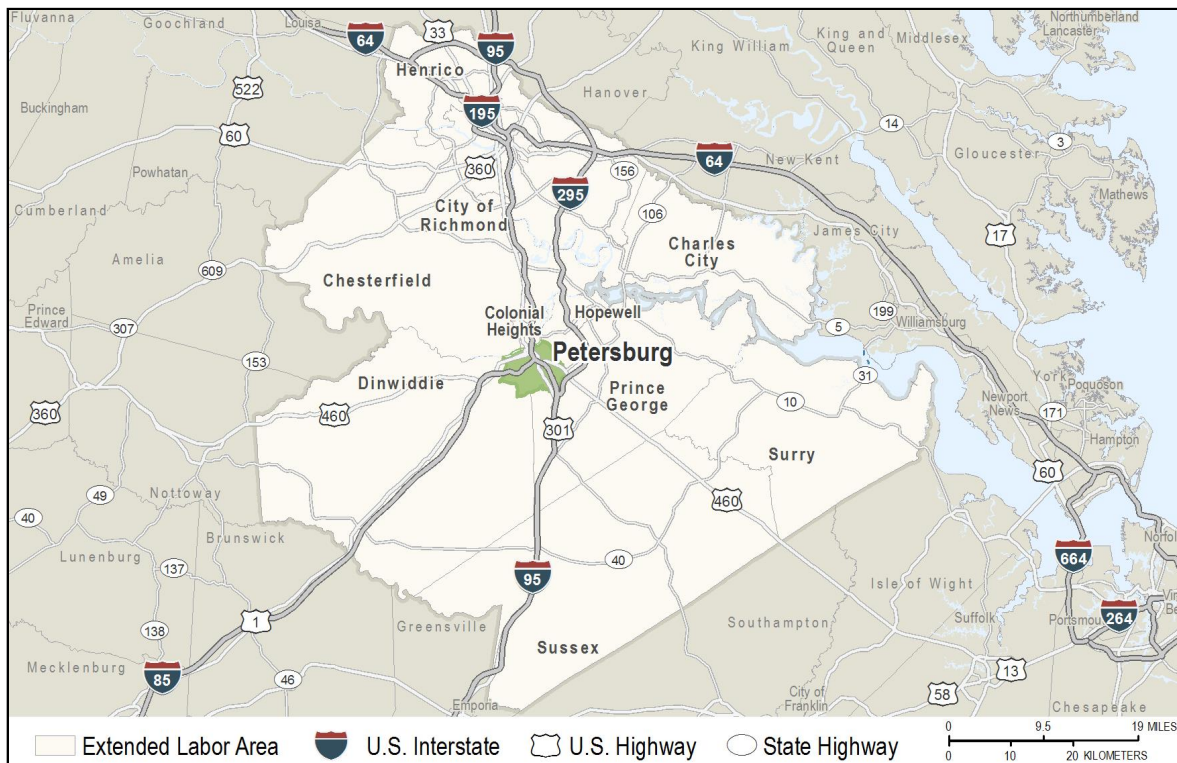
Location

The independent city of Petersburg consists of 23.1 square miles and is located in south-central Virginia. Petersburg is bordered on the north by the Appomattox River. The city, strategically located at the junction of Interstates 85 and 95 and the site of two mainline railroads, enables industries to easily access the markets of the East and Midwest.

Located along the eastern seaboard, approximately halfway between New York and Florida, Petersburg is situated at the juncture of I-95 and I-85.

Petersburg is 23 miles south of Richmond and 125 miles south of Washington, D.C. The Port of Hampton Roads is 80 miles southeast.

The city of Petersburg is located in the Richmond Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA).

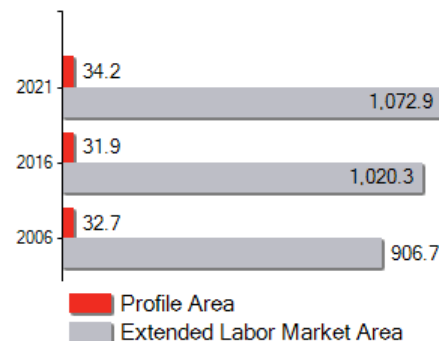

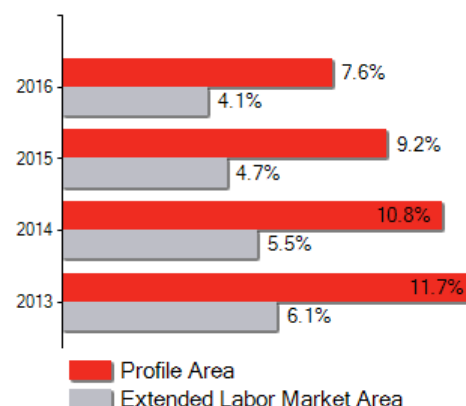

Government and Taxes

Government

Petersburg has a City Manager and a seven-member City Council.

The city has a comprehensive plan and zoning and subdivision ordinances.

The MSA is home to many historical sites including the Petersburg National Battlefield, a key Civil War landmark.

Taxes

Localities in Virginia collect a 1% sales tax. They do not tax other items taxed at the State level.

Counties and cities in Virginia are separate taxing entities. Therefore, a company pays taxes to either a county or to a city.

If a company is located in a town, it pays town and county taxes except for utility taxes which are paid only to the town and the license tax which is paid only to the town unless town law permits the additional collection of a county tax.

Manufacturers pay real estate, machinery and tools, truck and automobile, utility, and sales taxes.

Nonmanufacturers pay real estate, tangible personal property, truck and automobile, utility, and sales taxes. They also may pay either a merchants' capital or a license tax.

Community Facilities

Petersburg has two hospitals that provide medical services to residents. Southside Regional Medical Center is a 468-bed acute care facility with a staff of over 1,300 employees and 185 physicians representing all major specialties. Medical services at this center include 24-hour emergency care, surgery, trauma center, home health care, rehabilitation unit, physical therapy and nuclear medicine. Poplar Springs Hospital, a 100-bed private psychiatric facility provides treatment programs for adults, adolescents and the chemically dependent. John Randolph Hospital in Hopewell is easily accessible to Petersburg residents. This 150-bed facility also offers a full range of medical services including 24-hour emergency care, surgery, physical and occupational therapy, nuclear medicine, and intensive and coronary care. In addition to these facilities, the Richmond area has 13 major service and five specialized hospitals with a total of more than 5,100 beds. Included within the Richmond area is the internationally renown Virginia Commonwealth University Medical Center.

Because of the numerous and outstanding medical facilities located in the metropolitan area, Richmond has been designated as a "Prime Medical Center" by the American Medical Association.

Cultural attractions can be found throughout the region including the Virginia Museum for Fine Arts.

The city of Petersburg has three facilities that provide nursing home care. With a total of 258 beds, these facilities offer long-term and intermediate care, as well as rehabilitative services.

There are over 185 physicians and 36 dentists who maintain practices in the city.

The Petersburg Public Library circulates a 122,247-volume collection among the main library and the two branches. Colleges and universities in the area also open their library facilities to the public. These library facilities include the 64,105-volume collection at Richard Bland College; the 75,472-volume collection at John Tyler Community College; and the 768,818-volume collection at Virginia State University.

There are over 100 places of worship representing the leading Protestant denominations, the Roman Catholic faith, and the Jewish faith in Petersburg.

Residents of Petersburg have numerous shopping opportunities available throughout the metropolitan area. There are over 350 retail and service-related businesses, five shopping centers and a mall located in Petersburg. The "Old Towne" area of the city offers unique specialty stores, antique shops and an array of restaurants. As part of the Richmond-Petersburg metropolitan area, city residents enjoy easy access to more than 75 shopping centers and regional malls located throughout the region.

A state-of-the-art Southside Regional Medical Center opened in 2008.

Lifestyle

The Petersburg area has a variety of historical, cultural and recreational activities to offer its residents. The city has played an important part in American history. As an area under siege in both the Revolutionary and Civil Wars, Petersburg has numerous buildings and sites to attract the history enthusiast. Of particular interest is the Petersburg National Battlefield. Silent cannons now mark the locations of old Civil War battle lines and fortifications in this 809-acre park. Living history reenactments highlighting camp life, drills and battles are held throughout the summer. Other historical attractions in Petersburg include Blandford Church with fifteen magnificent stained glass windows created by Louis Tiffany and Centre Hill Mansion that served as headquarters for Union forces during the Siege of Petersburg. The city also has a wealth of museums including the Quartermaster Museum, which displays unique Army items such as General Patton's jeep and General Eisenhower's uniforms; the Siege Museum which depicts the effect of a city under a 10-month siege; and the United States Slo-Pitch Softball Association's National Headquarters and Museum, which honors those persons who have made contributions to the game of amateur softball.

Cultural activities in Petersburg include performances by local theater groups, a symphony orchestra and a ballet company. The Popular Lawn Arts Festival held each spring attracts visitors from throughout the region.

Boating and fishing are popular activities on the Appomattox River and nearby Lake Chesdin. Public recreational facilities in the city include five local parks that have picnic areas and hiking trails; 24 athletic fields; 15 tennis courts; two swimming pools; and an 18-hole golf course.

The mountains and Atlantic Ocean are both within a 90-mile drive of Petersburg.

Petersburg's close proximity to Richmond enables residents to take advantage of the many museums, historical sites, cultural events and sporting events that the Capital City has to offer. Richmond attractions and events include the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts, the Science Museum of Virginia, the Children's Festival, Arts in the Park and the three-week Richmond International Festival of Music.

Outdoor recreational activities abound including NASCAR and two theme parks.

Taxes

Non-manufacturer's personal property, machinery and tools, and real estate taxes are all assessed based on a percentage of the original total capitalized cost, excluding capitalized interest. Below are the assessment ratios currently used by the City of Petersburg to assess the value of company property subject to taxes:

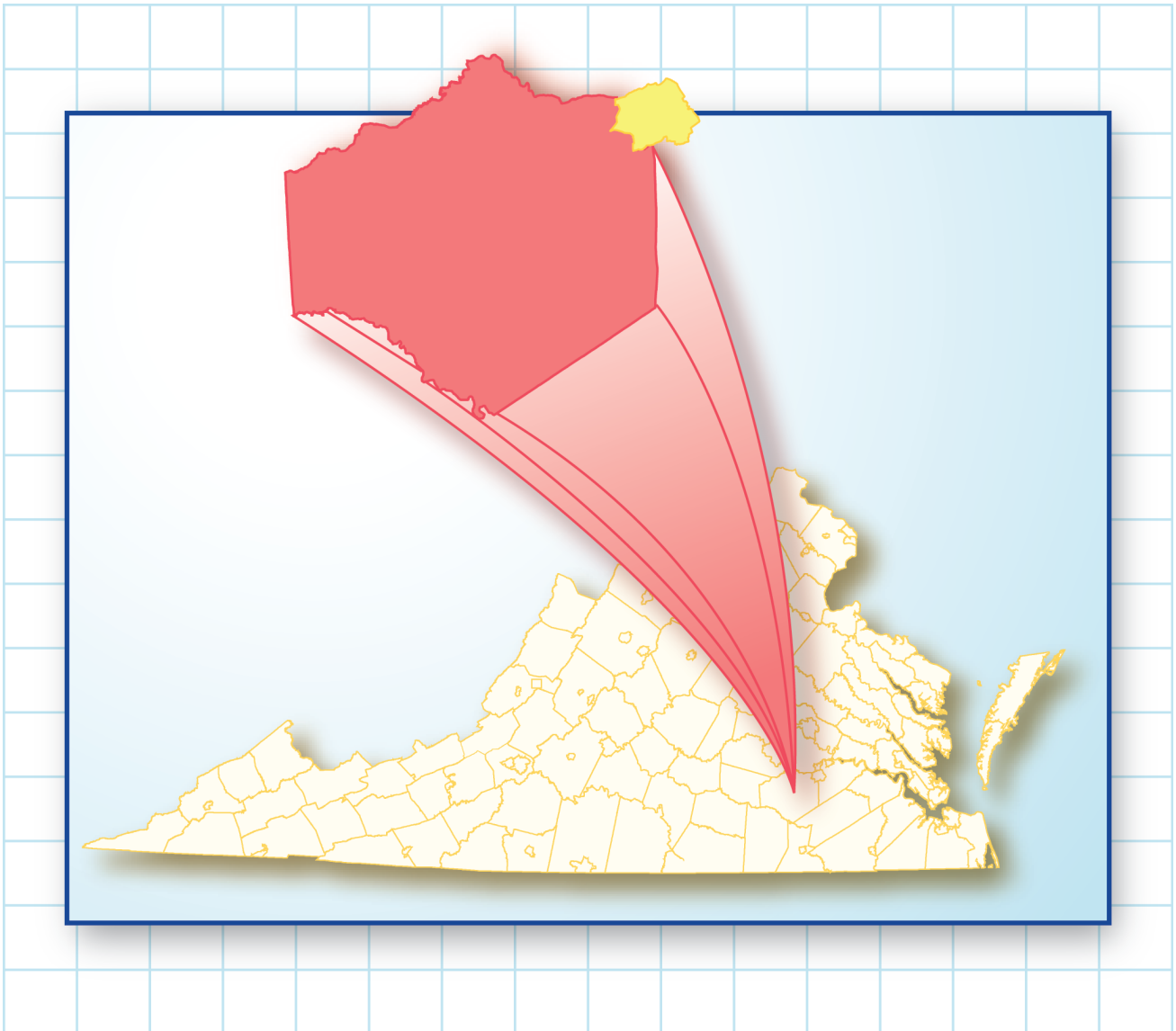

Overview

This Demographic Profile provides an in-depth analysis of the population in Petersburg city. Most of the data is produced by the U.S. Census Bureau, and includes demographic characteristics such as age, race/ethnicity, and gender.



Related Terms and Definitions

Ability to speak English

For people who speak a language other than English at home, the response represents the person's own perception of his or her ability to speak English. Because census questionnaires are usually completed by one household member, the responses may represent the perception of another household member.

Age

The age classification is based on the age of the person in complete years as of April 1, 2010. The age of the person usually was derived from their date of birth information. Their reported age was used only when date of birth information was unavailable.

Gender

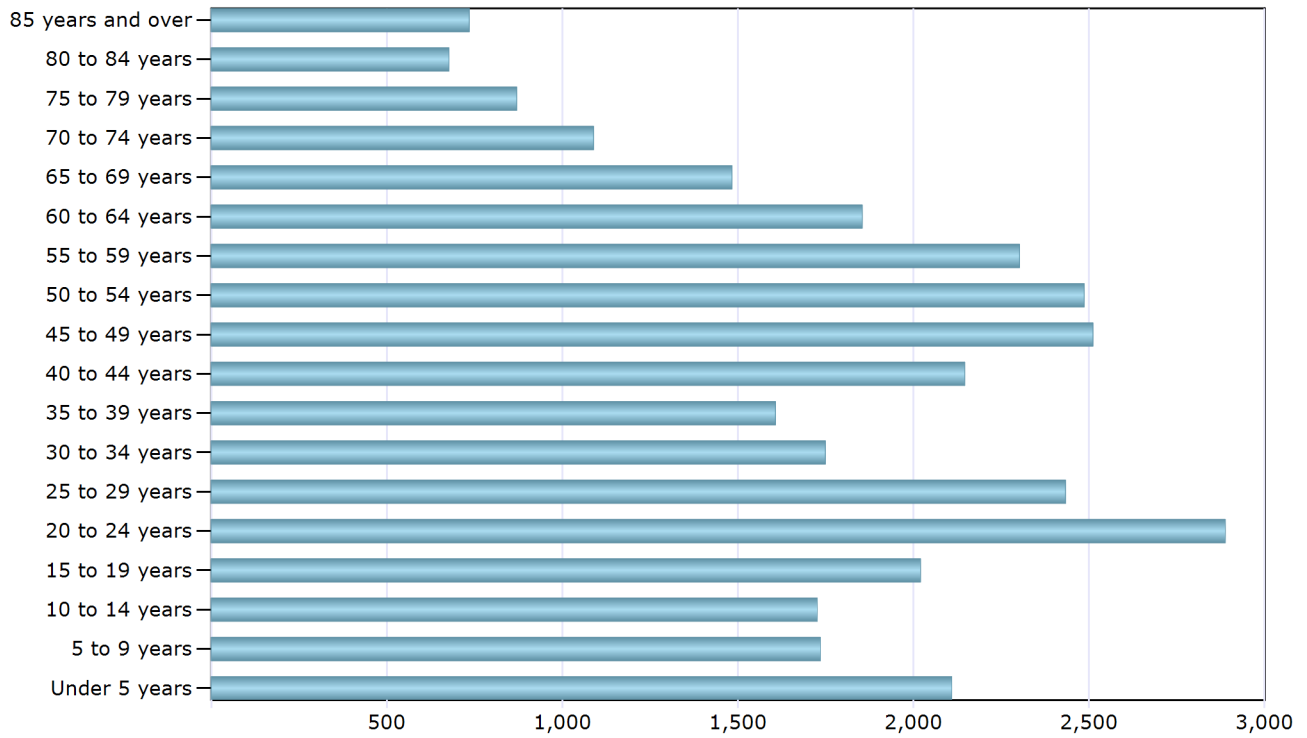
The data on gender were derived from answers to a question that was asked of all people. Individuals were asked to mark either "male" or "female" to indicate their gender. For most cases in which gender was not reported, it was determined by the appropriate entry from the person's given (i.e., first) name and household relationship. Otherwise, gender was imputed according to the relationship to the householder and the age of the person.

Race

The concept of race as used by the Census Bureau reflects self-identification by people according to the race or races with which they most closely identify. The categories are sociopolitical constructs and should not be interpreted as being scientific or anthropological in nature. Furthermore, the race categories include both racial and national-origin groups.

Please note: In the past, our population by race/ethnicity data has always excluded the Hispanic ethnicity from each race category. Starting in January 2013, each race category now includes all ethnicities.

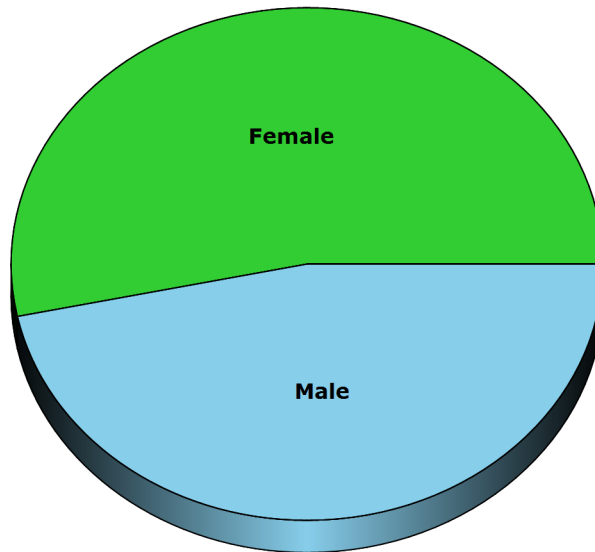

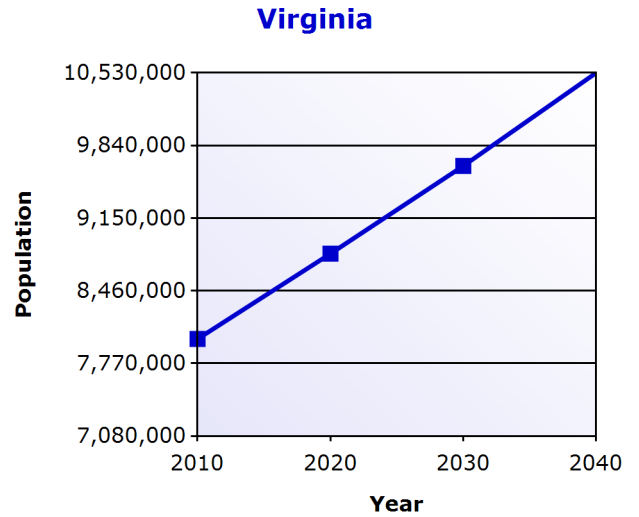
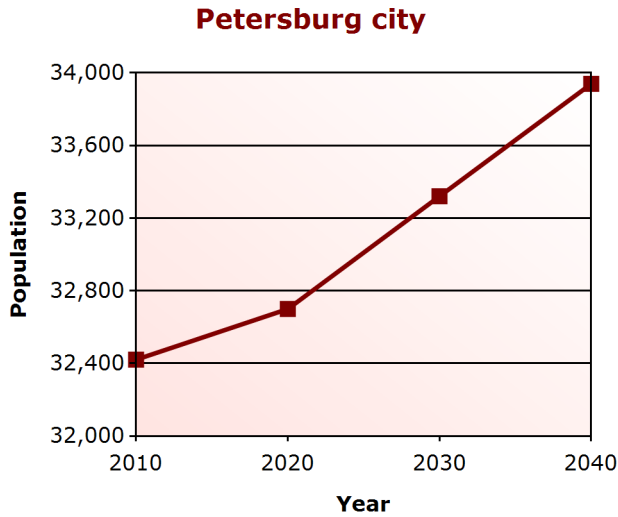
Population by Gender

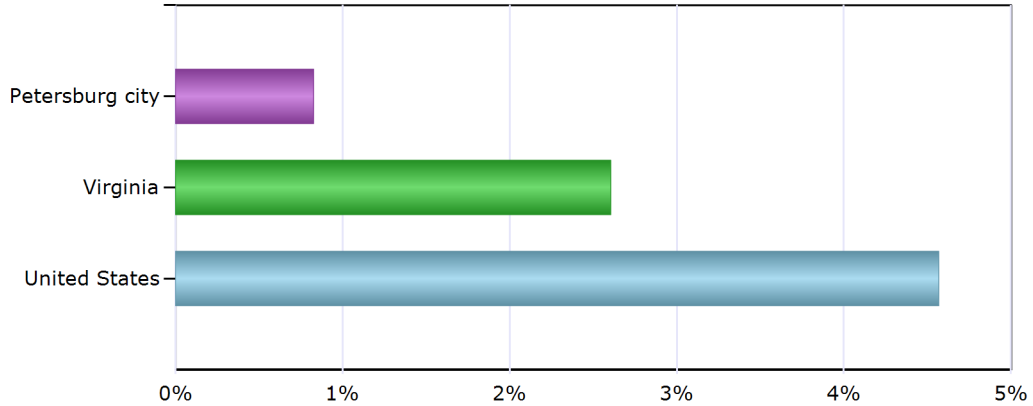

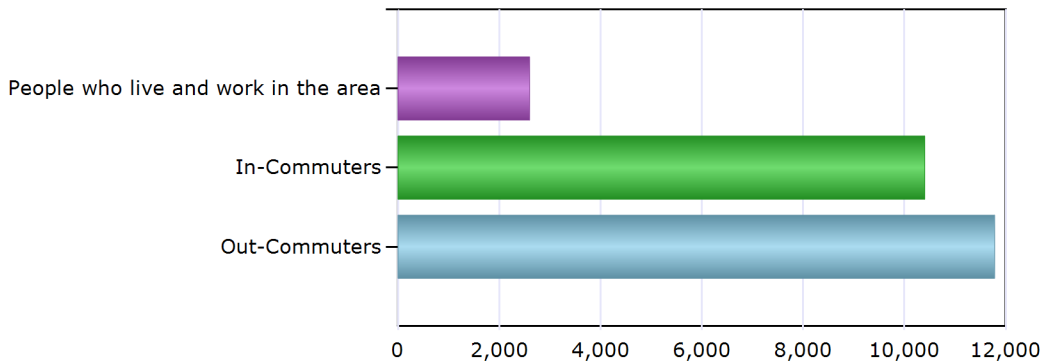

Related Terms and Definitions

Average Weekly Wage

Computed as average quarterly wages divided by 13.

Consumer Price Index (CPI)

The Consumer Price Index measures the average change over time in the prices paid by urban consumers for a representative market basket of consumer goods and services.

Local Employment Dynamics (LED)

The Local Employment Dynamics Program at the Census Bureau, together with its state partners, provides employment information at the county, city, and Workforce Investment Area level. This information tracks workers in different industries by age and gender and provides statistics on job creation, separation, turnover, and wages.

Quarterly Census of Employment & Wages (QCEW)

A federal/state cooperative program that collects and compiles employment and wage data for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and the federal civilian workers covered by Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE). These data are maintained at the state in micro and macro levels and also sent to BLS quarterly.

Unemployment Insurance (UI)

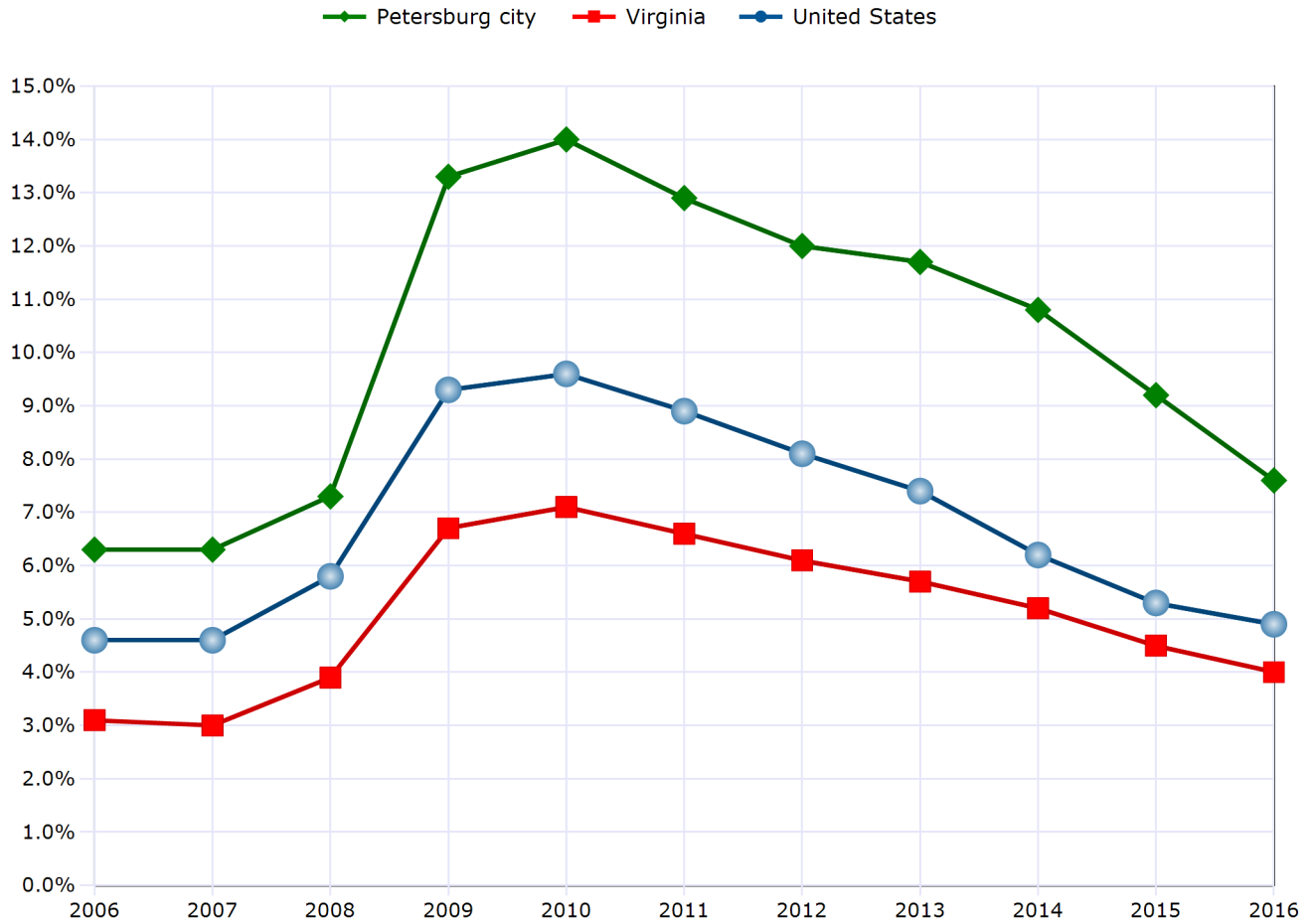
Unemployment insurance is a program for the accumulation of funds paid by employers to be used for the payment of unemployment insurance to workers during periods of unemployment which are beyond the workers' control. Unemployment insurance replaces a part of the worker's wage loss if he becomes eligible for payments.

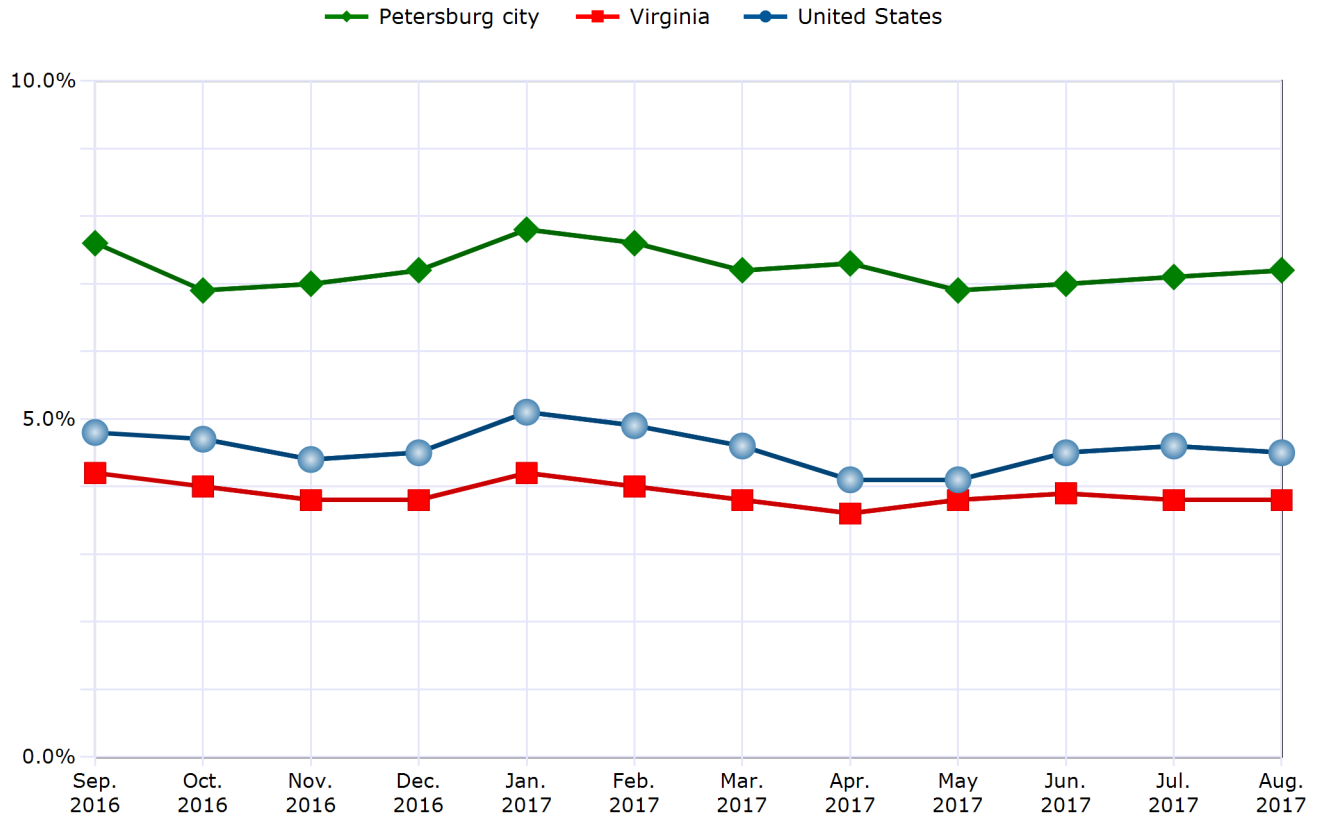

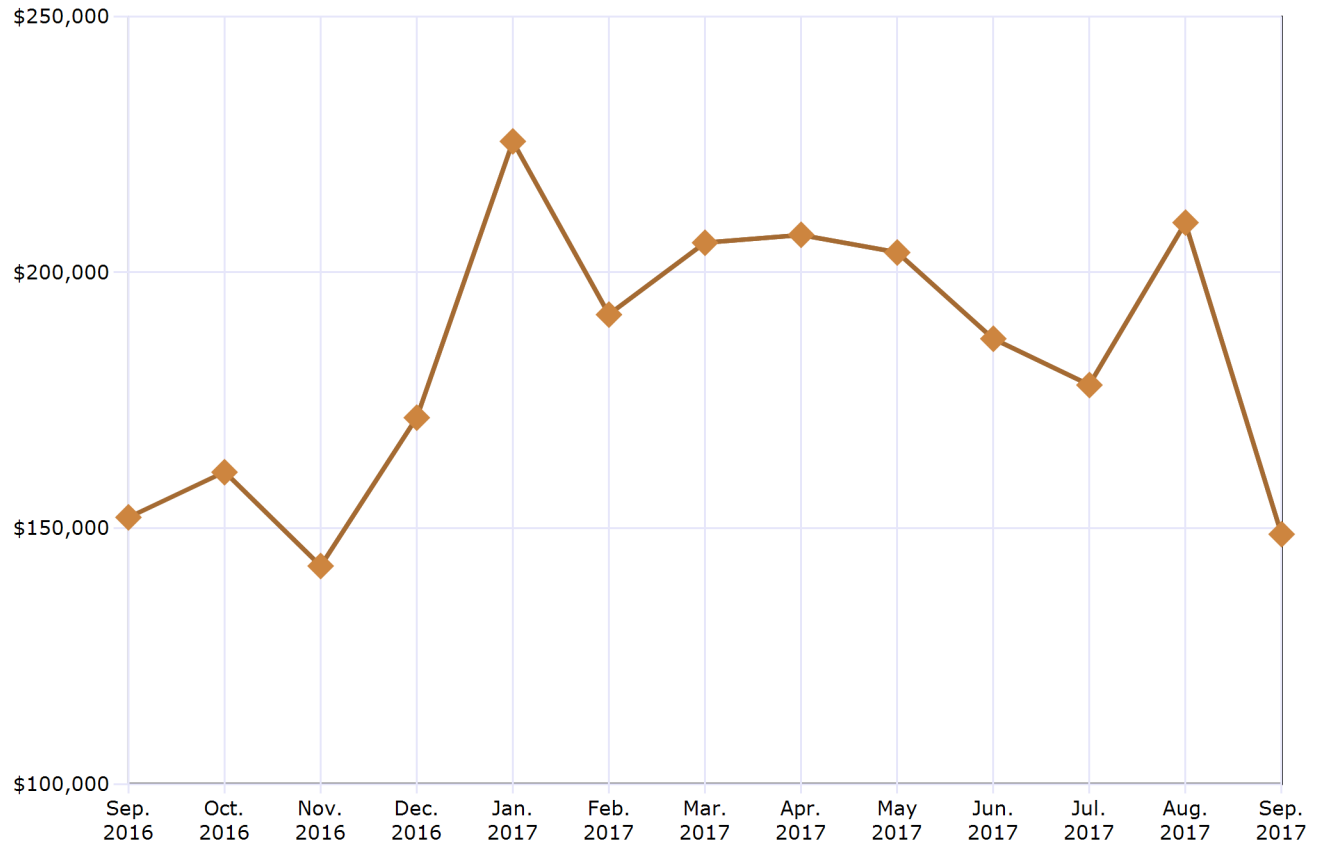

Employment by Industry

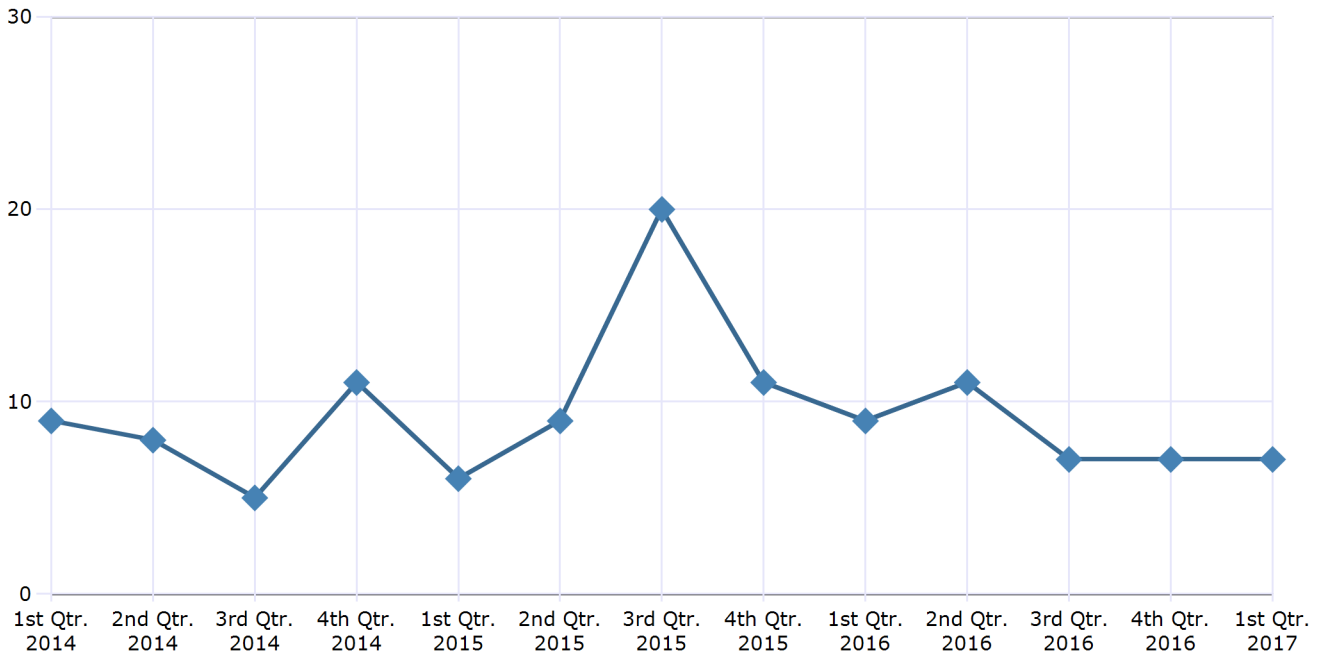

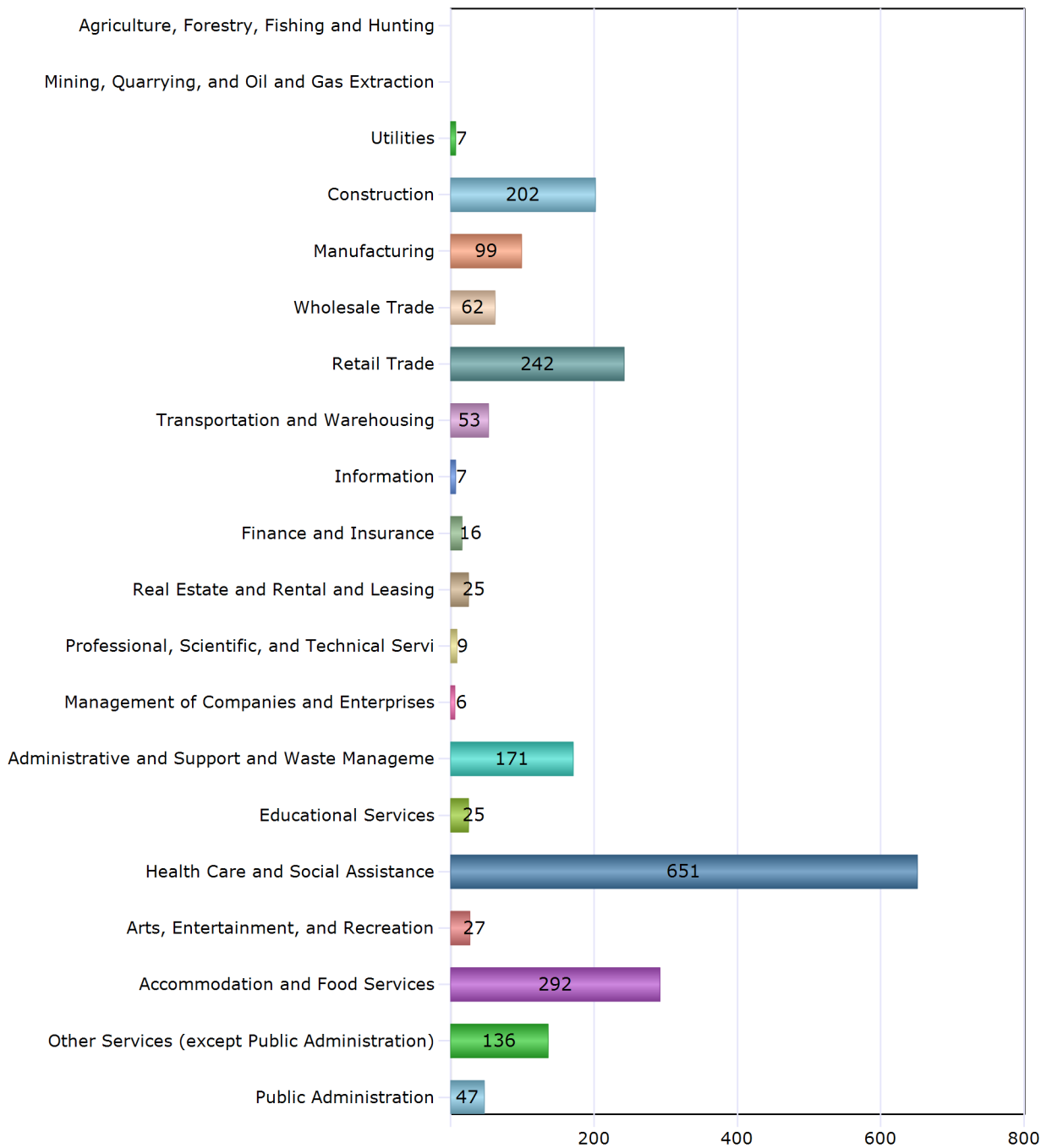

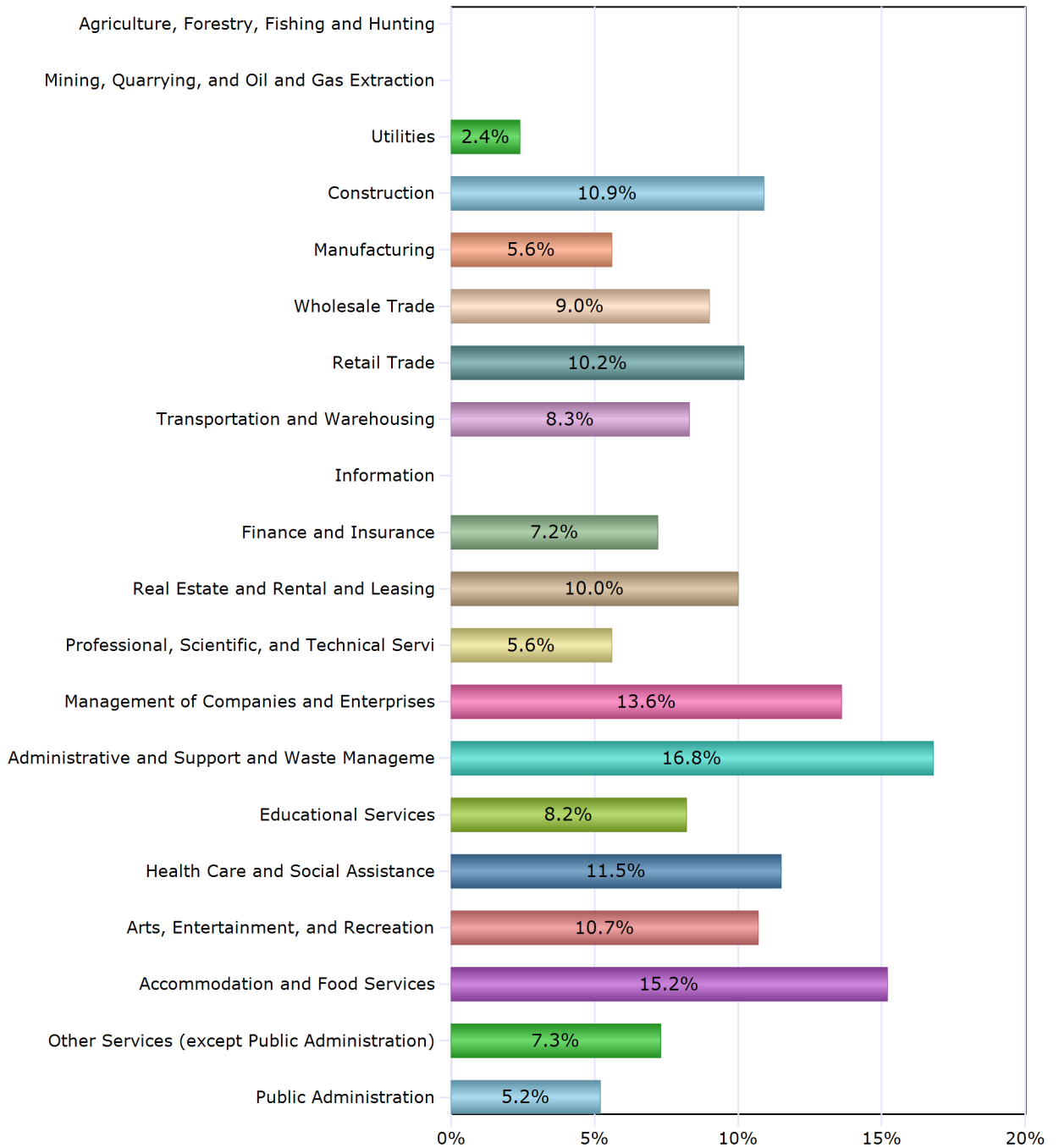
New Hires by Industry

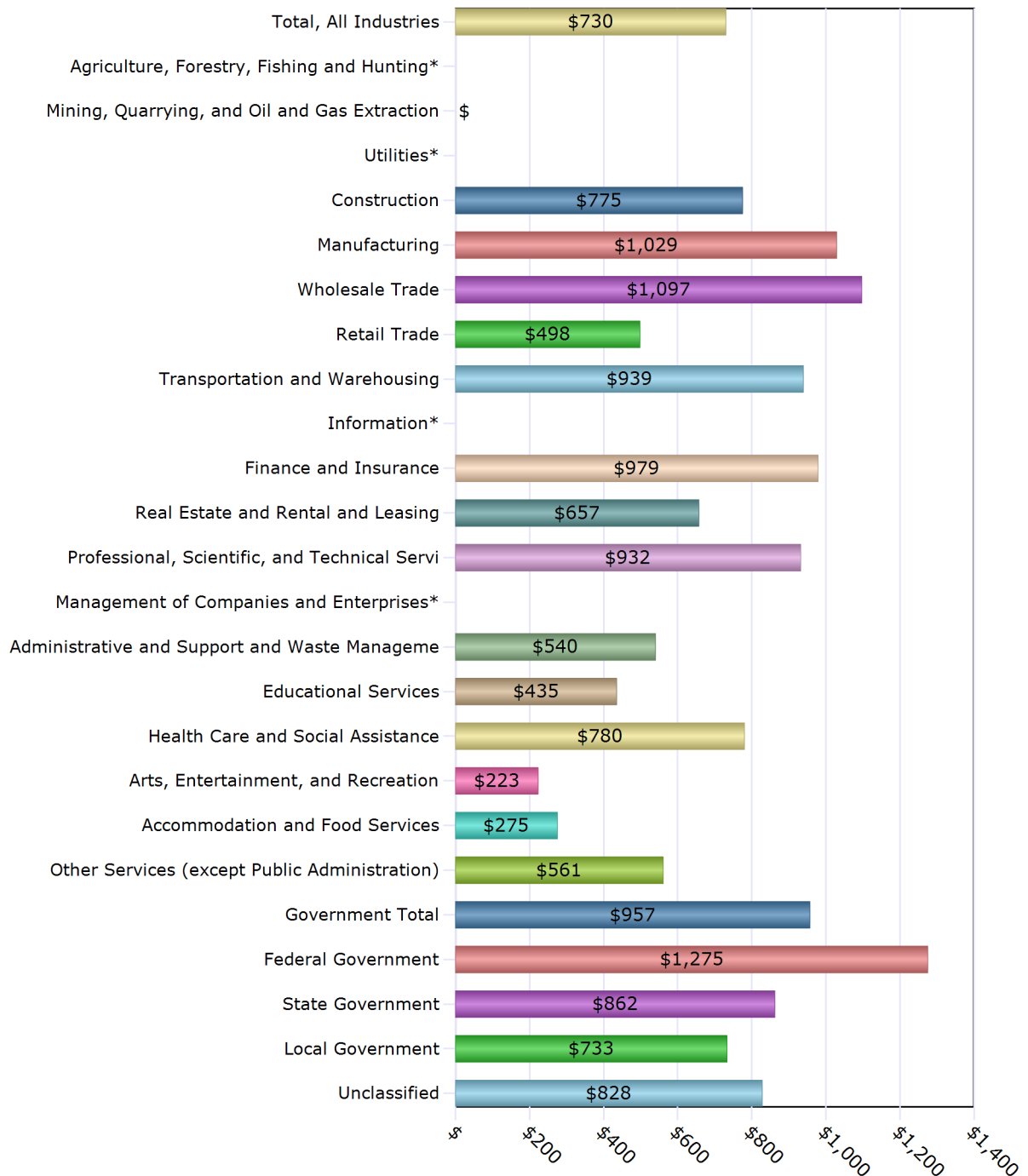
Turnover by Industry

What is LED?

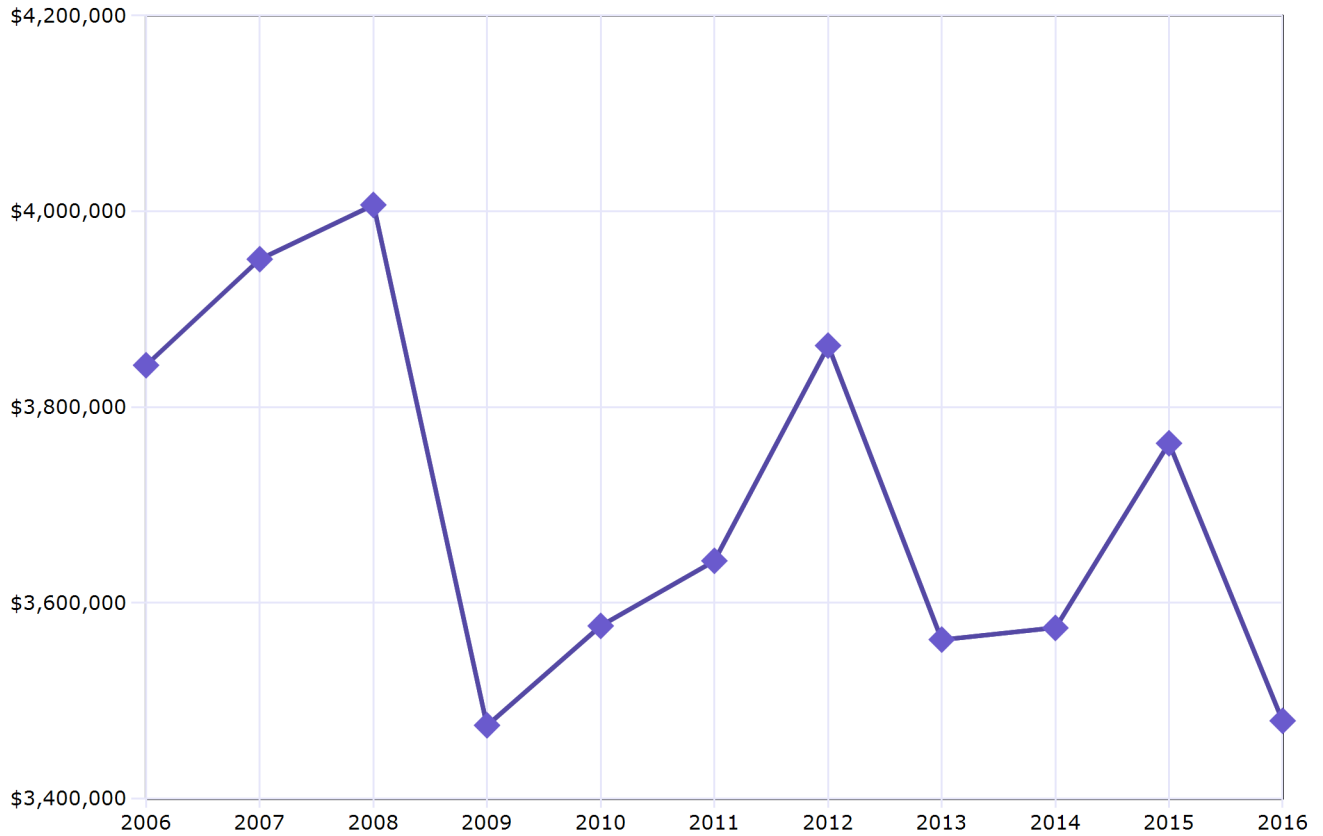

Trends

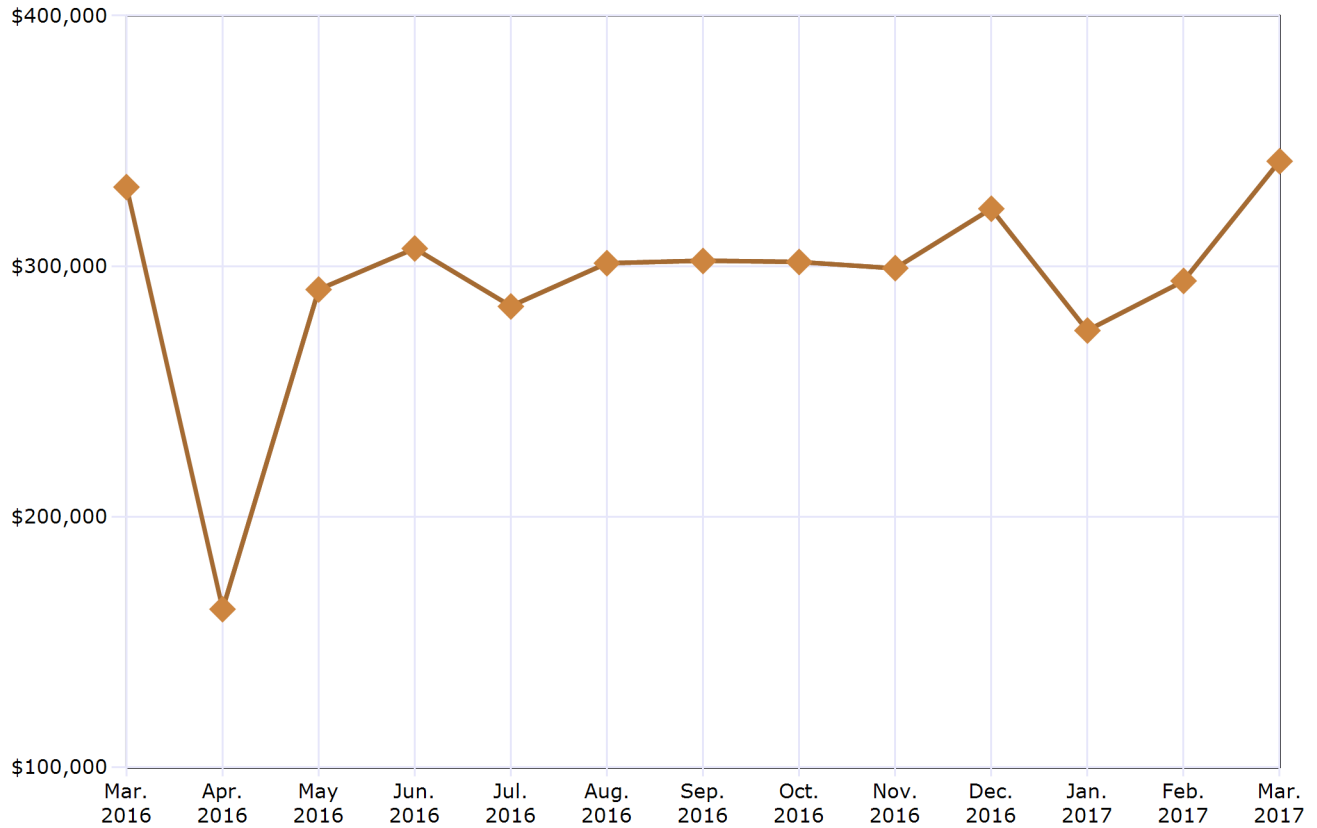

Related Terms and Definitions

Associate's degree

An award that normally requires at least two but less than four years of full-time equivalent college work.

Bachelor's degree

An award that normally requires at least four but not more than five years of full-time equivalent college-level work.

Post-baccalaureate certificate

An award that requires completion of an organized program of study equivalent to 18 semester credit hours beyond the bachelor's. It is designed for persons who have completed a bachelor's degree, but do not meet the requirements of a master's degree.

Master's degree

An award that requires the successful completion of a program of study of at least the full-time equivalent of one but not more than two academic years of work beyond the bachelor's degree.

Post-master's certificate

An award that requires completion of an organized program of study equivalent to 24 semester credit hours beyond the master's degree, but does not meet the requirements of academic degrees at the doctor's level.

Doctor's degree

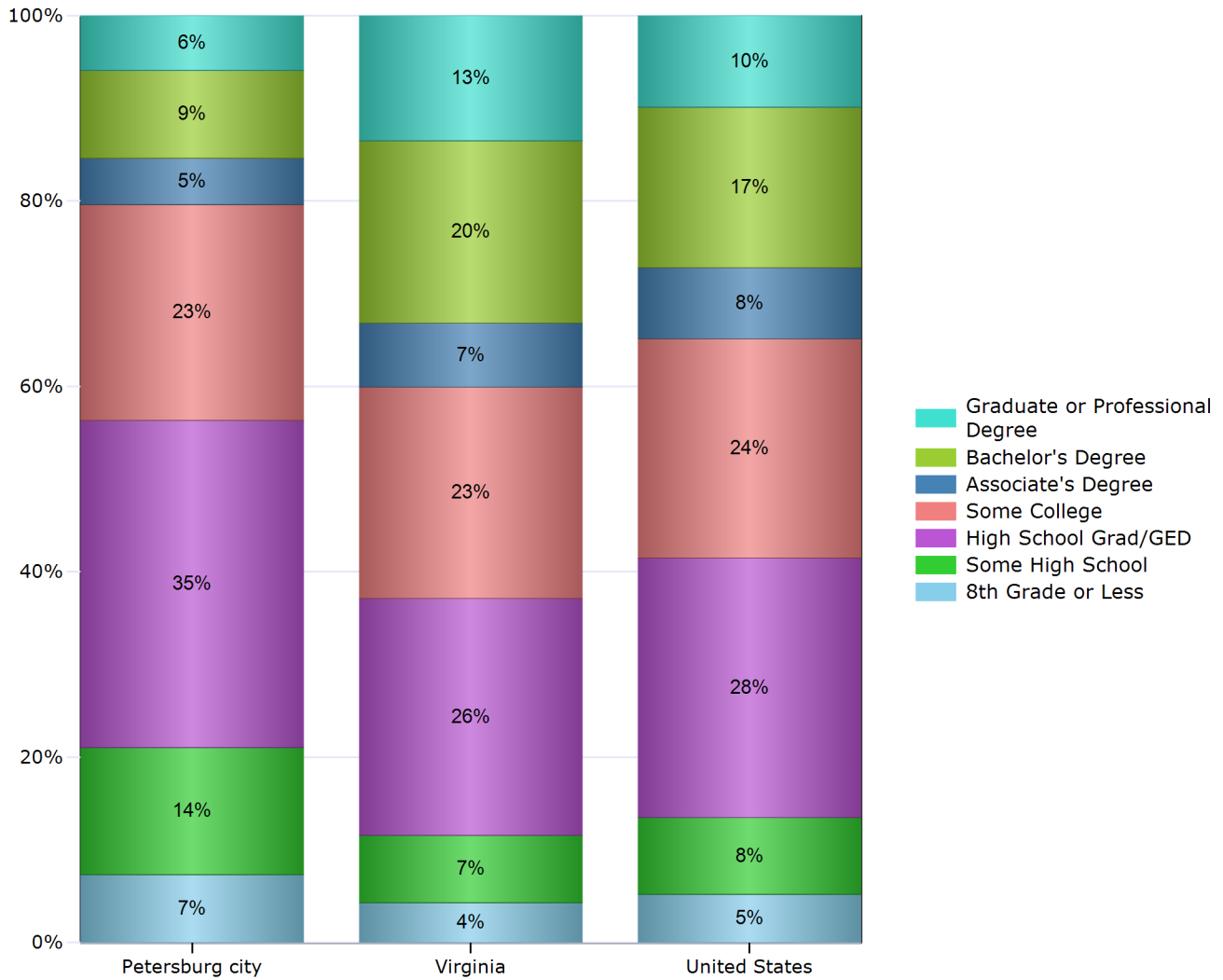
The highest award a student can earn for graduate study.

First-professional degree

An award that requires completion of a program that meets all of the following criteria: (1) completion of the academic requirements to begin practice in the profession; (2) at least two years of college work prior to entering the program; and (3) a total of at least six academic years of college work to complete the degree program, including prior required college work plus the length of the professional program itself.

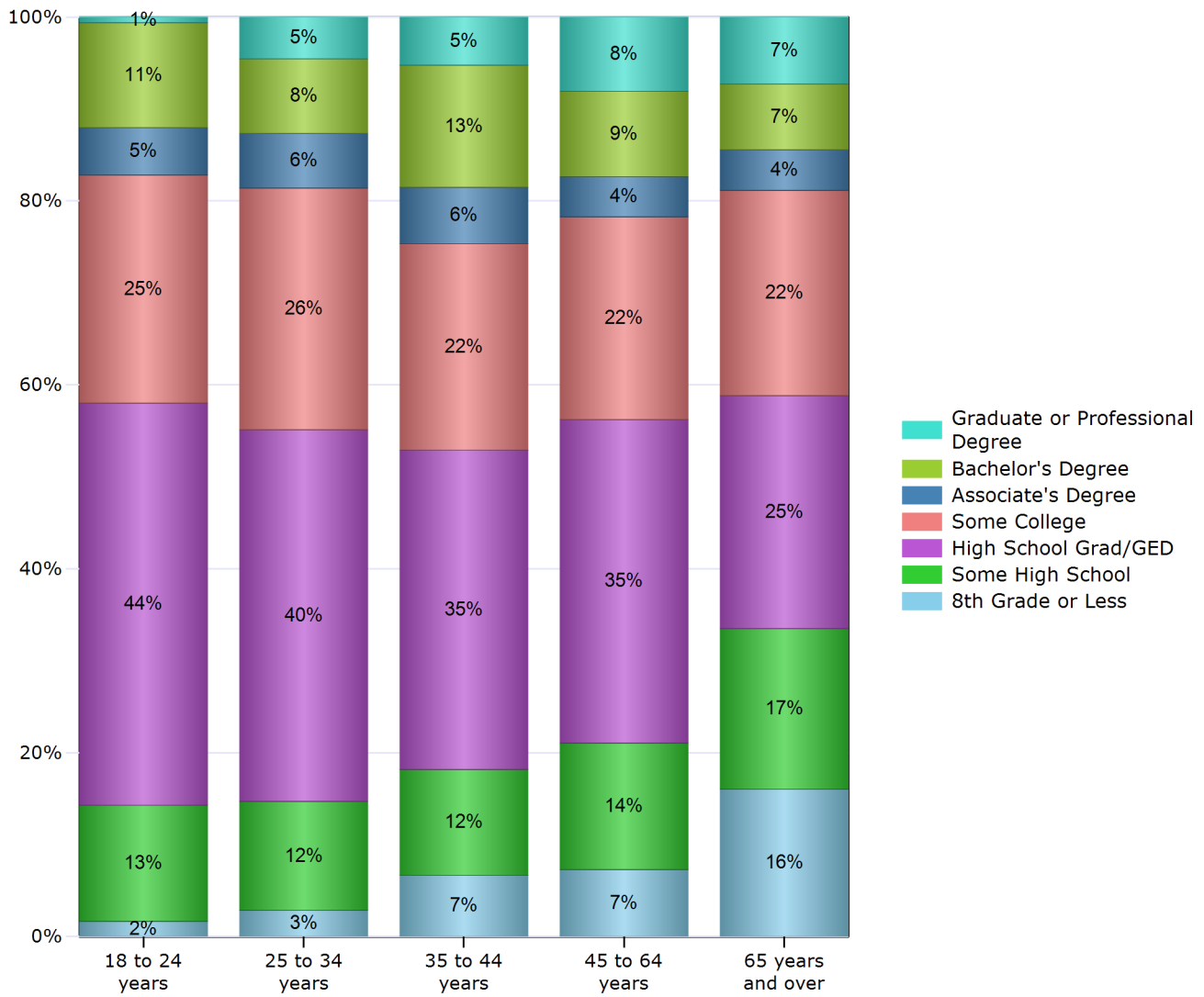

Educational Attainment by Age

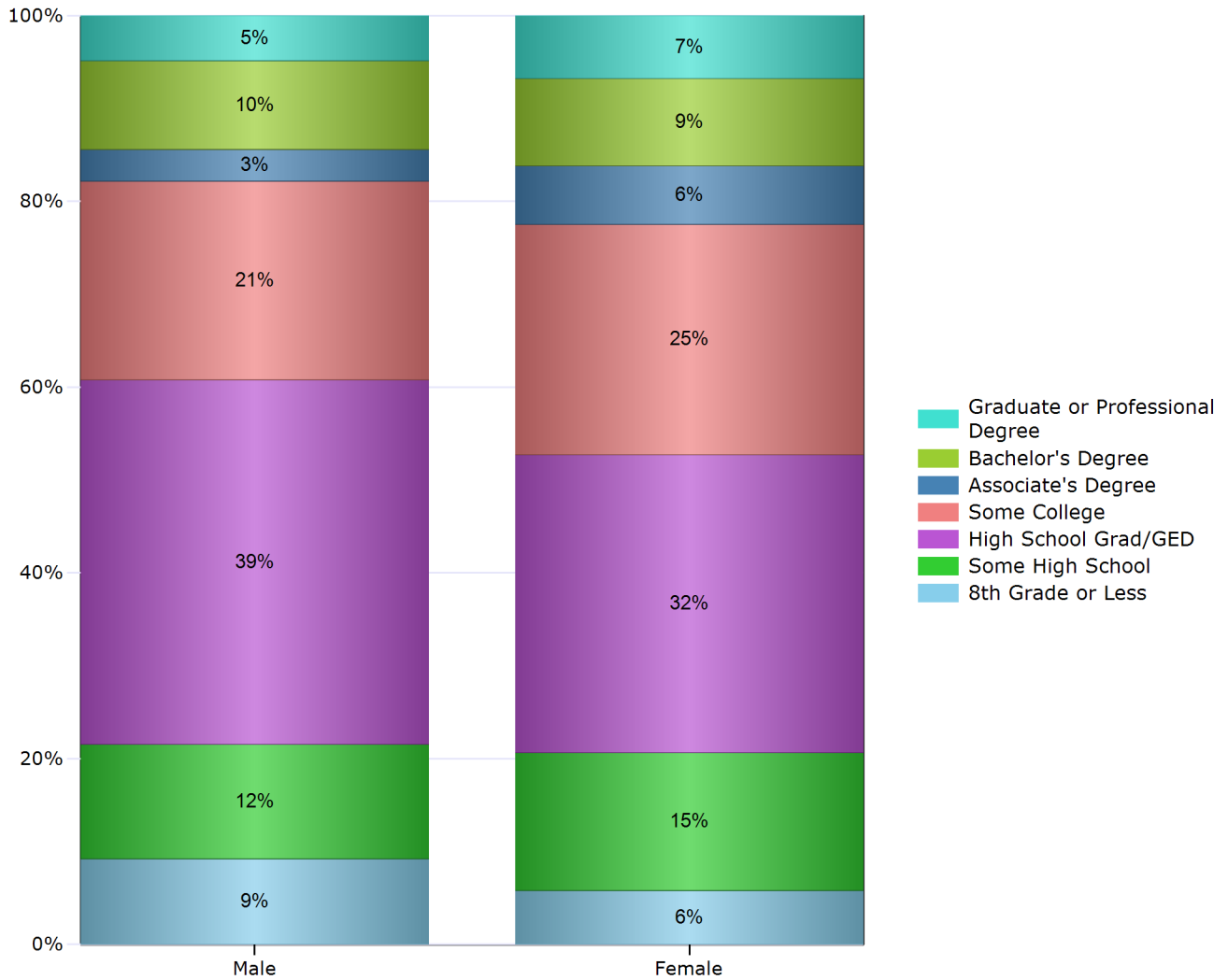

(Population 18 years and over)

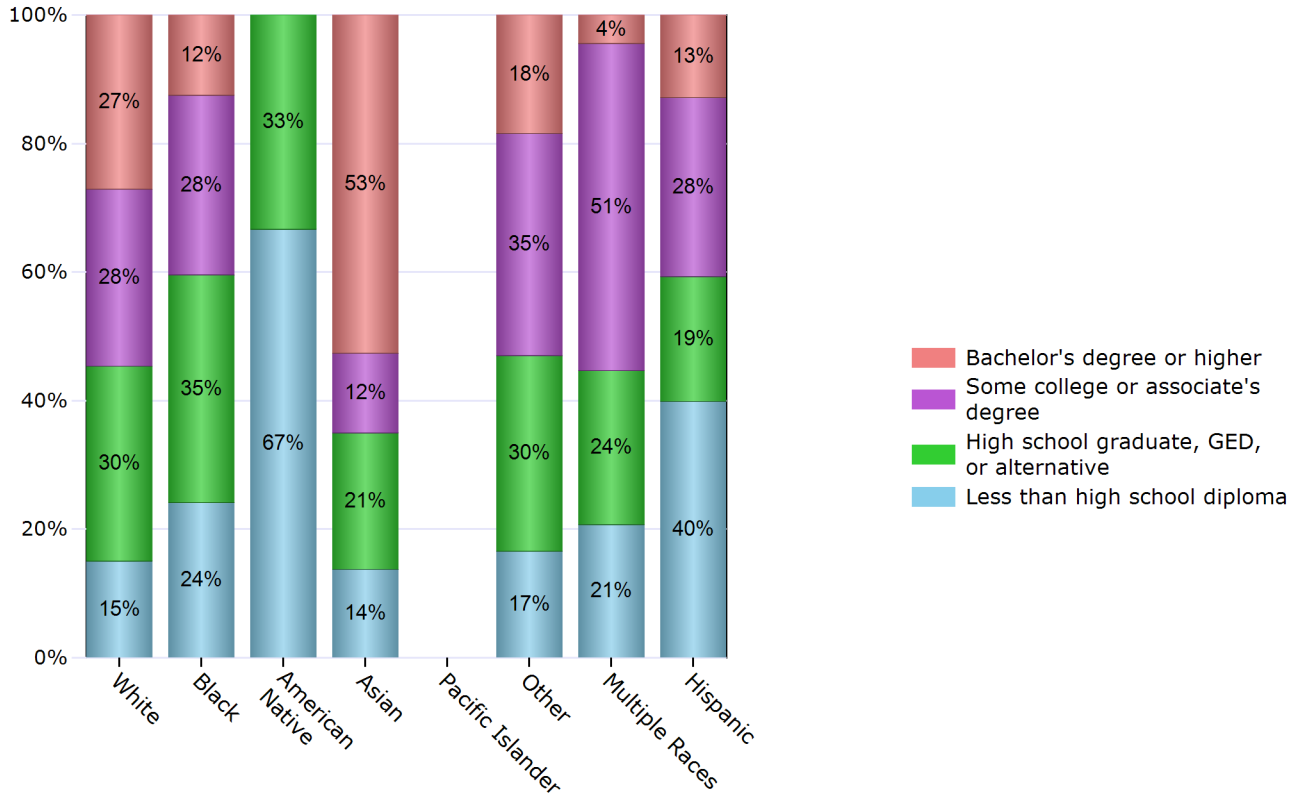
