## Location




Prince George County is centrally located in southeastern Virginia. This 266 square mile county is bordered on the north by the James River and the west by the Appomattox River. The cities of Petersburg and Colonial Heights constitute the southwest border and Hopewell forms the northeast border. Prince George County is ideally situated on Interstates 95 and 295 and provides ready access to all major East Coast and Sunbelt markets.

Prince George County is 25 miles southeast of Richmond and 130 miles south of Washington, D.C. The Port of Hampton Roads is 90 miles southeast.

The county is located within the Richmond Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA).

Prince George County provides ideal access to all major east coast and sunbelt markets via Interstates 95 and 295.





#### **Taxes**

Localities in Virginia collect a 1% sales tax. They do not tax other items taxed at the State level.

Counties and cities in Virginia are separate taxing entities. Therefore, a company pays taxes to either a county or to a city.

If a company is located in a town, it pays town and county taxes except for utility taxes which are paid only to the town and the license tax which is paid only to the town unless town law permits the additional collection of a county tax.

Manufacturers pay real estate, machinery and tools, truck and automobile, utility, and sales taxes.

Nonmanufacturers pay real estate, tangible personal property, truck and automobile, utility, and sales taxes. They also may pay either a merchants' capital or a license tax.

# **Community Facilities**

Abundant medical facilities are available to Prince George County residents throughout the metropolitan area. Southside Regional Medical Center in Petersburg, a 311-bed acute care facility, offers extensive facilities and services that include 24-hour emergency care; intensive and coronary care; physical rehabilitation; and a school of nursing. John Randolph Hospital in Hopewell with 150 beds also offers a full range of services. The Virginia Commonwealth University Medical Centeris located in the city of Richmond. This internationally known teaching and research hospital offers the latest technology, services and facilities. Numerous other medical facilities and services are available throughout the Richmond-Petersburg metropolitan area.

The public health center provides extensive county-wide medical services including immunizations, obstetrics, well baby clinics, and home health care. John Randolph Hospital, in Hopewell, operates a 124-bed nursing home facility. An additional 23 nursing care facilities are located throughout the metropolitan area.

There are over 2,000 physicians and 500 dentists who practice in the Richmond-Petersburg metropolitan area. In the immediate area of Prince George County, Hopewell and Petersburg, there are approximately 150 physicians and 70 dentists.

The mountains and Atlantic Ocean are both within a 90-mile drive of Prince George County.

Prince George County is a member of the Appomattox Regional Library System. This library system circulates over 119,000 volumes. Four branches of this library are located in the county. Library facilities at the numerous colleges and universities located in the Richmond-Petersburg metropolitan area are also open to the public. These systems include the 64,105 volume library at Richard Bland College; John Tyler Community College with a 75,472 volume collection; and Virginia State University with 768,818 volumes.

Over 40 places of worship representing the leading Protestant denominations, the Catholic Church and Jewish synagogues are located in the county and Hopewell.

The County provides recreational facilities in conjunction with public school sites and residential subdivisions, accessible from all parts of the County. All-season youth and adult sports, physical fitness programs, family trips & activities, special interest classes and youth support day camp programs are offered by the PG Department of Recreation & Parks. Four parks in the County, Scott Memorial Park, Temple Recreation Park, Appomattox River Regional Park, and JEJ Moore Athletic Complex, are open to residents from dawn to dusk.

Numerous shopping opportunities are available to area residents. A broad mix of commercial establishments are located in Prince George County at several shopping centers. As part of the Richmond-Petersburg metropolitan area, county residents enjoy easy access to more than 75 shopping centers and malls located throughout the region.

The new, state-of-the-art Southside Regional Medical Center opened in 2008.



# Lifestyle

Prince George County and the metropolitan area offer a variety of historical, cultural and recreational opportunities. For the Civil War enthusiast there is the Petersburg National Battlefield Park, Pamplin Park, the Siege Museum, the Museum of the Confederacy, the US Quartermaster Museum (Fort Lee) and the US Army Women's Museum (Fort Lee) and the Richmond National Battlefield Park. Other historical sites in the area include six James River Plantations, homes of presidents and historical notables.

Cultural attractions in the area include the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts, which displays an extensive collection of world art; the Science Museum of Virginia, which features a computer center, Imax/Omnimax space theater and numerous permanent and traveling exhibitions; and the Valentine Museum, where decorative arts and exhibitions on the social and political history of the area are displayed. Other cultural activities include theatrical performances by ten area production companies and scheduled national touring productions; musical performances by the Virginia Opera and the Petersburg and Richmond Symphonies; and performances by the Richmond Ballet and the Concert Ballet of Virginia.

Recreational opportunities are also plentiful in the Prince George County area. The James and Appomattox Rivers offer fishing, boating, and water skiing activities. Several marinas are located on the Appomattox River. Pocahontas State Park in nearby Chesterfield County offers hiking, ball fields, picnic facilities, and three lakes for swimming, boating, and fishing. Prince George County also has two county owned and operated parks which offer walking trails, ball fields, tennis courts, and picnic facilities. During the hunting season, Prince George forests yield many deer, turkey and small game.

The MSA is home to many historical sites including the Petersburg National Battlefield, a key Civil War landmark.



## I. Introduction

This report provides a community profile of Prince George County. It is intended to complement the information found in our Virginia Workforce Connection application, which can be accessed online at:

www.VirginiaLMI.com

The report is divided into three major sections. The first contains a profile of regional demographic characteristics and trends, the second supplies similar information for the regional economy, and the third provides a profile of regional education characteristics.

## II. Demographic Profile

#### **Overview**

This Demographic Profile provides an in-depth analysis of the population in Prince George County. Most of the data is produced by the U.S. Census Bureau, and includes demographic characteristics such as age, race/ethnicity, and gender.



#### **Related Terms and Definitions**

#### **Ability to speak English**

For people who speak a language other than English at home, the response represents the person's own perception of his or her ability to speak English. Because census questionnaires are usually completed by one household member, the responses may represent the perception of another household member.

#### Age

The age classification is based on the age of the person in complete years as of April 1, 2010. The age of the person usually was derived from their date of birth information. Their reported age was used only when date of birth information was unavailable.

#### Gender


The data on gender were derived from answers to a question that was asked of all people. Individuals were asked to mark either "male" or "female" to indicate their gender. For most cases in which gender was not reported, it was determined by the appropriate entry from the person's given (i.e., first) name and household relationship. Otherwise, gender was imputed according to the relationship to the householder and the age of the person.

#### Race

The concept of race as used by the Census Bureau reflects self-identification by people according to the race or races with which they most closely identify. The categories are sociopolitical constructs and should not be interpreted as being scientific or anthropological in nature. Furthermore, the race categories include both racial and national-origin groups.

**Please note**: In the past, our population by race/ethnicity data has always excluded the Hispanic ethnicity from each race category. Starting in January 2013, each race category now includes all ethnicities.



The Economic Profile of Prince George County consists primarily of data produced by the Virginia Employment Commission, U.S. Census Bureau, and the Bureau of Labor Statistics.



#### **Related Terms and Definitions**

#### **Average Weekly Wage**

Computed as average quarterly wages divided by 13.

#### **Consumer Price Index (CPI)**

The Consumer Price Index measures the average change over time in the prices paid by urban consumers for a representative market basket of consumer goods and services.

#### **Local Employment Dynamics (LED)**

The Local Employment Dynamics Program at the Census Bureau, together with its state partners, provides employment information at the county, city, and Workforce Investment Area level. This information tracks workers in different industries by age and gender and provides statistics on job creation, separation, turnover, and wages.

# Quarterly Census of Employment & Wages (QCEW)

A federal/state cooperative program that collects and compiles employment and wage data for workers covered by state unemployment insurance (UI) laws and the federal civilian workers covered by Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE). These data are maintained at the state in micro and macro levels and also sent to BLS quarterly.

#### **Unemployment Insurance (UI)**


Unemployment insurance is a program for the accumulation of funds paid by employers to be used for the payment of unemployment insurance to workers during periods of unemployment which are beyond the workers' control. Unemployment insurance replaces a part of the worker's wage loss if he becomes eligible for payments.





#### **Employment by Industry**





#### New Hires by Industry



### Turnover by Industry







#### **Overview**

#### **Related Terms and Definitions**

#### **Associate's degree**

An award that normally requires at least two but less than four years of full-time equivalent college work.

#### Bachelor's degree

An award that normally requires at least four but not more than five years of full-time equivalent college-level work.

#### Post-baccalaureate certificate

An award that requires completion of an organized program of study equivalent to 18 semester credit hours beyond the bachelor's. It is designed for persons who have completed a bachelor's degree, but do not meet the requirements of a master's degree.

#### Master's degree

An award that requires the successful completion of a program of study of at least the full-time equivalent of one but not more than two academic years of work beyond the bachelor's degree.

#### Post-master's certificate

An award that requires completion of an organized program of study equivalent to 24 semester credit hours beyond the master's degree, but does not meet the requirements of academic degrees at the doctor's level.

#### **Doctor's degree**


The highest award a student can earn for graduate study.

#### First-professional degree

An award that requires completion of a program that meets all of the following criteria: (1) completion of the academic requirements to begin practice in the profession; (2) at least two years of college work prior to entering the program; and (3) a total of at least six academic years of college work to complete the degree program, including prior required college work plus the length of the professional program itself.






