

With the \$162M expansion of AdvanSix Inc., a leading advanced manufacturer making nylon 6 resin, VGR's industrial business portfolio was strengthened even more. Approximately \$100M of the AdvanSix investment is in new construction, with the remaining \$62M being invested in existing infrastructure.

Highlights of Global 3.0

2020 will mark the final year of VGR's five-year "Global 3.0" strategic plan. The plan's goals include:

- 50 announcements
- Creation of 3,000 new jobs
- New Capital Investments of \$700 million
- Foreign Direct Investments of \$150 million

The Global 3.0 Activity Report below shows VGR continues to exceed partner expectations with a five-year cumulative total of 49 announcements, 3,381 new jobs, \$892.5 million in new capital investment, and \$235.1 million in FDI toward the five-year goals for the region.

BUSINESS EXPANSION

It's more than business as usual.

THE ECONOMIC ENGINE THAT IS FORT LEE

VGR hosted a familiarization tour for employees of the Virginia Economic Development Partnership in September to showcase the vast workforce training and critical operations that occur at the Army's Fort Lee military base, located in the heart of the region.

The group was escorted by Captain Junias Jackson and toured the Quartermaster Museum, the Live Paratrooper Training Center, the U.S Army Ordnance School and the U.S. Army Transportation School. Fort Lee supports nearly 28,000 people on post and 63,000 people off post. As many as 70,000 troops pass through its classrooms each year, making it the third largest training site in the Army.

RETAIL ACADEMY SHARPENS LOCAL RECRUITMENT STRATEGIES

VGR and Retail Strategies hosted a Retail Academy for communities in October to help them learn how to attract retail through data analysis.

During the two-day event, participants attended a group session on current retail trends and education on the implementation and execution of a retail recruitment strategy. Individual city and county participants also received consulting sessions including a research portion consisting of demographic data and reports, a trade area analysis powered by mobile data, a retail gap analysis, and additional analytics.

SITE SELECTORS TOUR REGION

VGR hosted four site selection consultants visiting from Atlanta on a VEDP-sponsored tour. VGR showcased the Port of Virginia, CCAM, a local manufacturer and initiated discussions around workforce readiness. Many positive comments resulted like this one:

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At Pegasus Partners, we deliberately picked to visit the Gateway Region to get a better understanding of the overall assets. We work with German industrial SMEs and after the visit we are convinced that more German FDI needs to be directed into the Gateway Region. COLLABORATION IS A MAINSTAY

VGR hosted several Lunch & Learn events with VEDP staff throughout the year. These sessions included local economic development leaders and ensure that VGR maintains collaborative relationships and is at the forefront of any project activity at the state level.

THE BIRTH OF VIRGINIA'S MANUFACTURING REGION

Virginia's Manufacturing Region is a collaboration between Virginia's Gateway Region, Virginia's Growth Alliance and the Lynchburg Regional Business Alliance to market the region globally as a top advanced manufacturing destination. This new region, nicknamed VMR, is active and has a new website <u>vamanufacturing.com</u>. VMR-specific marketing missions are now underway to seek new projects for the three regions.

FOLAR

The partnership between The Friends of the Lower Appomattox River (FOLAR) and Virginia's Gateway Region Economic Development Organization (VGR) forms a unique bond that enhances the region's economy and quality of life. FOLAR's recent successes in advancing the Appomattox River Trail (ART) continues to support and embolden VGR's mission. When completed, the ART will link the six jurisdictions along the river and increase transportation and recreation opportunities while improving air quality, reducing roadway congestion, offering boating and fishing access, and encouraging ecotourism. VGR is immensely grateful for the organization's aggressive persistence to support regional economic development.

COMMUNITY IMPACT

CHESTERFIELD COUNTY

In 2019, Chesterfield County continued reinforcing its strong business portfolio, with end-of-year announcements equaling a total of \$274.1 million in investments, 2,167 new employees, and 822,066 square footage of infrastructure as a result of 10 new company locations and three business expansions. With a \$1.5 million investment for a project to lease 26,866 square feet of additional space, Chesterfield's largest economic development announcement in 2019 was The Results Companies' expansion of client engagement operations to Midlothian, bringing approximately 600 new career opportunities to the region's workforce. Other companies highlighted in Chesterfield's 2019




economic development announcements, included: Carvana, IMPREG Group, ERNI Electronics, Petal Card, Productiv, Texas Roadhouse and Virginia Physicians for Women all locating in the County as well as expansions of Richmond Animal League and Super Radio Coils. The locality's healthy environment for business, convenient central location in the Commonwealth, broad range of housing options and access to a wide assortment of recreational and athletic activities all make it an ideal place to live, work, play and raise a family. Lastly, with a host of business and professional organizations such as the Chesterfield County Chamber of Commerce, there are plenty business support resources ready to help new or existing companies looking to relocate or expand.

CITY OF COLONIAL HEIGHTS

The City of Colonial Heights ended 2019 with exciting economic development progress being made, including several retail highlights and the expansion of one of its major assets. Keystone Tractor and Truck Museum completed a 35,000 square-foot expansion, making it the City's biggest economic development announcement. Keystone's expansion allows the addition of more tractors. trucks and antiques to its unique display, which together are worth millions of dollars, and opens space for hosting larger gatherings and conventions and a destination attraction along the I-95 corridor. The center for "All Things Retail," Colonial Heights continued evolving into a key regional retail destination. Located only 25 minutes south of Richmond, the locality presents the only major retail center along I-95 between the state capital and the North Carolina border, and has a retail trade area population of over 1.1 million consumers. The City promotes commercial development and welcomed Conn's HomePlus, H&M, Boot Barn, Mission BBQ and an Extended Stay America® hotel. The City also participated in the "50 Years of Love" campaign for National Travel and Tourism Week in partnership with Petersburg Area Regional Tourism and the Virginia Tourism Corporation.





CITY OF HOPEWELL

With rapid growth in the locality's downtown area and strong industrial investments in 2019, the City of Hopewell continued revitalization while increasing economic sustainability. The \$162 million expansion of AdvanSix was Hopewell's largest economic development announcement. Around \$100 million is in construction with the remaining \$62 million being in infrastructure renovation. AdvanSix is a leading manufacturer of nylon 6 resin, chemical intermediates and fertilizer. The facility is one of the world's largest single-site producers of its kind. Additionally, Hopewell saw roughly 12 ribbon cuttings and is looking at approximately \$250-350 million in investments, including industrial. New business includes Captain D's, CVS Pharmacy, Pasta Diner and Wonder City Bakery. A boom of sustainable growth continued downtown. Besides a bustling hub of businesses, there's plenty to do including the newly established Hopewell Riverwalk, which is the city's portion of the Appomattox River Trail's 20-plus-mile project encompassing the Tri-Cities. Hopewell's vibrant downtown includes a hub of activity such as the Beacon Theatre and Boathouse at City Point, which draw approximately 150,000 customers each year, thereby increasing foot traffic and business patronage to the city core.

CITY OF PETERSBURG

In 2019, the City of Petersburg hosted its Business Appreciation Celebration, announcing Southside Regional Medical Center as the largest employer and the Petersburg YMCA as the biggest project of the year. The Business Appreciation Celebration commemorated Business Appreciation Month, SBA National Small Business Week, expressed appreciation for contributions existing businesses make to the local, regional, state, national and global economies, and recognized the success of small and large businesses. Additionally, the City hosted an Opportunity Zone Forum, which educated participants on understanding the economic, social impacts of opportunity zones, including how to secure capital and invest in a Virginia opportunity zone and determine if a business or real estate project is within one. Petersburg was involved in the Food Access Research Project presented by Virginia Commonwealth University's Urban Commercial Revitalization Fall 2019 Graduate Class. Petersburg also celebrated the addition of Boppers Malt Shop and Burnette's Baked Goods, and continued seasonal community events, such as the Festival of Grapes and Hops. Situated about halfway between New York and Florida, Petersburg is at the juncture of major Interstates 95 and 85, only 24 miles south of the Virginia state capital of Richmond, strategically positioning the locality near a hub of transportation infrastructure ideal for companies looking to relocate business or existing companies considering expansion.








DINWIDDIE COUNTY

In 2019, Dinwiddie County Economic Development welcomed several new business partners and celebrated expansions of existing businesses, seeing a year of continued growth. One of Dinwiddie's major economic development announcements was the county's addition of Kaisa USA, a company in the advanced manufacturing sector that assembles and distributes loose-leaf paper, spiral notebooks and composition books. The 260,000 square-foot facility sits on a 50-plus-acre property near the Town of McKenney. The County also celebrated ribbon-cutting ceremonies for Browder's Towing and Service Center as well as Elite Contracting's new headquarters. A significant announcement was the addition of Dominion Energy's new Dinwiddie-Petersburg local district office and operations center where roughly 100 employees will be housed. There were several new retail businesses which opened their doors as well, including: O'Reilly Auto Parts, Richlands Creamery and the Dinwiddie Diner. Richlands' expansion included the addition of their creamery to the farm's existing dairy operations, which contains an onsite processor for producing bottled milk and ice cream.

PRINCE GEORGE COUNTY

Economic growth in Prince George County rose in 2019 with 416 new business licenses permitted in the locality, an 18% increase from the previous year. Nine businesses completed or started new private investment including Campofrio, which was the County's largest economic development announcement. One of the largest companies in the processed meat sector, Campofrio located into a 143,790 square-foot cold storage facility at Southpoint Business Park. Additional announcements in Prince George included: NVR, Southside Physician Network, Proud Mama Kitchen, Morelia Mexican Restaurant, Tree Time Adventure and Fitness Park, Prince George Hibachi Hut, Virginia Physicians for Women and Sheetz. Of note, NVR is investing \$11.5 million in new capital as well as 201 new jobs over the next five years. During 2019, Prince George responded to 22 industrial prospects with 11 site visits evaluating potential locations. Additionally, the locality participated in numerous economic and workforce development activities such as Prince George's 6th Business Roundtable Alumni Dinner, which served as an opportunity for economic development and tourism with business; a Virginia State University College of Business career awareness session; the Virginia Career Works Crater Region LEAN Workshop; the Virginia Economic Development Partnership's "Lunch & Learn" series; and a Retail Academy hosted by Virginia's Gateway Region (VGR) in coordination with Retail Strategies.







SURRY COUNTY

Big things happened for Surry County in 2019. Urban Grid Solar, a solar energy company, completed construction of two solar farm facilities, and was the County's largest economic development announcement. Together, the 1,800-acre Colonial Trail West and 1,150-acre Spring Grove I will represent the largest contiguous solar projects to come online in Virginia. Other major news from 2019 included discussions with a prospect about plans to open a grocery store in the Town of Surry. The local market will contain a 7,000 square-foot grocery portion of the building in addition to a refrigerated section. Surry County Economic Development attended VGR's Retail Academy on attracting retail through data analysis, which aided in securing the grocery deal. Furthermore, a newly constructed Farmer's Market Pavilion will be a huge asset in attracting vendors, farmers and community patrons with the desire to promote healthier lifestyles through healthy food options, community engagement and supporting the local farm and agribusiness community through tourism. Moreover, efforts were made to promote small business with a focus on business retention and business relationships. Lastly, the final phase of Gray's Creek Marina was completed with construction of a bath house.

SUSSEX COUNTY

Major economic development steps were made in 2019 to attract business growth in Sussex County, with one of the biggest announcements being Three Brothers' Distillery, which received a Governor's Forestry and Agriculture Industries Development (AFID) grant in the amount of \$25K for road access development. The Disputanta agribusiness, which sells its locally distilled spirits in Virginia ABC stores, created another agritourism destination in the region. Furthermore, because of the investments Three Brothers' made in the County of Sussex, the distillery was picked up and featured on the Discovery Channel's television series "Moonshiners: Whiskey Business" in March. In addition, the County celebrated their first broadband connection through Prince George Electric Cooperative's RURALBAND project that brings fiber to the home. Sussex also held a ribbon-cutting ceremony for completing construction of the first new homes in the Town of Waverly, which was funded with a state Community Development Block Grant.



WAGE GROWTH SINCE 2016







PARTICIPATION RATE OF PRIME-AGE LABOR FORCE




UNEMPLOYMENT RATE





EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT 2018




