We're poised for great things to happen in Virginia's Gateway Region, and we can credit our strategic plan, "Transformative Growth 2025" for providing the guiding principles and tactics to move us toward these impactful goals.

In the past year, we celebrated with Phlow as the first medicines rolled off the production lines at a facility that was only a vision two years ago. Within the Petersburg area, we now offer the Campus for Advanced Manufacturing of Pharmaceuticals in the United States, more commonly known as CAMPUS, bringing together Phlow, Civica Rx and Novo Nordisk. This has created a synergistic industry cluster and solid foundation for new drug manufacturers, who will recognize the solid supply chain and trained workforce in our region.

While pharmaceutical manufacturing holds one priority, we recognize that our available sites and supporting infrastructure serve up the perfect ingredients for other industries, including distribution and energy. We also are shaping an emerging focus on data centers, which aligns with the Commonwealth of Virginia's current leadership in this space. With Petersburg voters passing a bill to allow a casino to operate in the city and the fall opening of the boutique Hotel Petersburg, we're seeing the momentum of signature retail, which provides additional diversity to our economic foundation.

We have long shared how important our infrastructure is to prospects, and we see that play out time and time again. We're located along the prime corridors of Interstates 95, 295 and 85, with easy access from the expanded rail corridor of the Port of Virginia. We have robust energy production. And, we are in the midst of major water infrastructure upgrades in Petersburg and Prince George County, bolstered by \$2 million in federal funds dedicated in part to increasing capacity and protecting the Appomattox River.


At the same time, we celebrate the strength of existing businesses, which are thriving across our footprint. Gerdau, for example, celebrated its 25th anniversary of steel production. Together, these successes contribute to the building of our communities and making VGR a desirable destination for economic growth.

ATLANTIC STRATEGIC MINERALS

Atlantic Strategic Minerals (ASM) an emerging critical minerals producer headquartered in Petersburg, announced in March that it is investing \$50 million to restore and reopen its existing Virginia-based mining and mineral processing operations. These operations include a mining operation in Dinwiddie County and a concentrator plant and mineral separation plant in Sussex County. The project will create 71 new jobs.

The Impact of This Deal

Meeting a Market Need: ASM's investment will help meet the growing demand for domestically produced critical minerals used as crucial components in a variety of supply chains, including the aerospace, renewable energy, consumer products, and defense industries. The country's economic vitality depends on these minerals.

Why This Investment: Not only does the region have the natural resources for mining these minerals, Virginia offers the infrastructure and a knowledgeable, skilled workforce in place that supported the relaunch of ASM's mining production after a 10-year hiatus. Sussex County is home to the largest Mineral Separator Plant (MSP) in North America.

Jobs and Downstream Benefits: The mining industry offers high-paying skilled jobs, while also touching on related sectors of the regional economy to help stimulate additional growth. ASM already has re-hired former employees at higher wages than they were earning in the interim. The company's return to this market is rekindling supportive industries, including trucking and heavy equipment operation/repair.

VGR's Role: We collaborated with the Virginia Economic Development Partnership, Dinwiddie County and Sussex County to secure the project and support ASM's job creation through the Virginia Jobs Investment Program (VJIP), which provides consultative services and funding to companies creating new jobs in order to support employee recruitment and training activities.

Deliver Innovative Resources to Communities

FACILITATE SITES AND BUILDINGS READINESS

Sussex Green Unveiled

Launched in August, the innovative 1,160-acre Sussex Green Enterprise Park aims to draw future-focused companies committed to integrating sustainability with commerce. Investing in economic investment of this magnitude requires a long-term commitment and vision from county leaders. The Virginia Tobacco Region Revitalization Commission and the Virginia Economic Development Partnership are providing important grant support.



VEDP Awards Readiness Grants

In August, two VGR localities received major grants from the Virginia Business Ready Sites Program, administered by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership (VEDP). Sussex County received a \$1.5 million grant for its Sussex Green Enterprise Park. Prince George County received \$10 million for its Crosspointe Logistics Centre, a 900 acre state-of-the-art manufacturing campus located along the I-95/I-295 corridor. Additionally, through a GO Virginia grant, VGR has assisted localities in elevating 10 regional sites to Tier 4 status.

Redevelopment in Former Tobacco Communities

Sussex County and the Town of Waverly are among communities receiving part of \$5 million in grants aimed at site development, agribusiness, tourism and business development in Southside and Southwest Virginia. The localities will apply their funds to continued redevelopment of the Waverly Business District. The grants were approved by the Virginia Tobacco Region Revitalization Commission.

Expansion of Infrastructure

Highlighting infrastructure assets makes Virginia's Gateway Region even more attractive to major manufacturers, distribution centers, and now data centers, because of the ready availability of water, power and access to vital north-south and east-west transportation routes. Two new initiatives are drawing attention

- Dominion Energy's Locks Campus is a living laboratory and innovation hub, supporting Dominion's quest to maintain reliability, meet evolving customer energy needs and develop the grid of the future.
- The Port of Virginia completed an \$83 million expansion program at its central rail yard to elevate logistics allowing increased capacity to run through the region.

Hotel Reflects Local Quality of Life

The Hotel Petersburg opened its doors in the fall, bringing another crown jewel to our regional economic development strategy. This restored historical facility will allow us to host prospects within our region, and demonstrates first-hand experiences of the vitality and breadth of services available in our localities.




Create a Cohesive Pharma Narrative



VGR Educational Attainment AGES 25-64 (in percent) 90% HAVE ATTAINED AT LEAST A HIGH SCHOOL DEGREE






